CALL FOR PAPERS

3rd ESFSS / European Symposium on Fire Safety Science



NANCY (FRANCE) 12TH-14TH SEPTEMBER, 2018

The 3rd European Symposium on Fire Safety Science will be held on September 12-14, 2018 at the University of Lorraine, in Nancy, France.

Following the conference held in Cyprus (2015), the 3rd ESFSS, will be the third edition of a series of symposia organized in Europe, with the participation of the International Association for Fire Safety Science (IAFSS). The aim is to gather researchers from and beyond Europe to have exchanges and discussions about fire safety science.

The program will have oral and poster sessions for the presentation of fully peer-reviewed papers over the three days, including invited lectures from world's top fire science researchers.

The 3rd ESFSS will be hosted by the LEMTA, a French laboratory affiliated to the University of Lorraine and the CNRS in Nancy, with the support of the *GDR Feux* – the French Research Group on Fire.

Research of interest

You are invited to submit a contribution that advances scientific understanding and/or presents new ideas in the entire spectrum of fire safety science. The topic areas include:

- Material behavior in fire (including Ignition, Pyrolysis, Flame Spread, Flame Retardants, Smouldering)
- Fire dynamics, structure in fires (including Compartment Fires, Pool Fires, Fire Plumes, Building fires, Tunnel fires, Fire safety engineering...)
- Wildland fires
- Fire suppression
- Evacuation and Human behavior

A half-day session will be dedicated to each of these five topics, with selected oral presentations and poster sessions.

Special topic: during the conference a special tribute will be also paid to Margaret Law for her work dedicated to fire safety and fire engineering.

Awards will be granted for the best paper, the best poster and the best presentation.

Paper submission and deadlines

Requirements

Papers: Must be original work. The same paper must not have been submitted to another symposium.

Style: All papers must be in English. Detailed information for authors on style, including paper length, format, etc, and a paper template will be available soon, via a link on the conference website. Poorly written papers will not be considered.

Oral Presentation: Oral presentation of the paper at the Symposium must be made by an author.

Paper submission: short papers (6 pages) will be asked to participants. Submitted papers will receive at least two independent peer reviews. Based on the reviews, accepted communications will be proposed either for oral presentation or for poster sessions. Final decisions on acceptance or rejection of a manuscript will be made by the Symposium Co-Chairs.

Authors will be notified of the preliminary decision by April 15, 2018. Notifications will include reviewers' comments and if accepted, detailed style guidelines for the final version of the paper, and the deadline for delivering a revised version in which all reviewers' comments have been addressed (May 15, 2018). Authors will be notified of the Program Co-Chairs' final decision by June 1, 2018. This final decision will be based on compliance of the revised papers with both the reviewers' comments and the formatting requirements of publication.

Publications and proceedings

All accepted papers, either for oral or poster presentation, will be published in *Journal of Physics: Conference Series*, an open journal with fast publication process, referenced in Scopus and Web of Science. A USB key will be also provided to all participants with a copy of the presented papers for immediate reading during the conference.

In addition, a selection of the best papers will be done, based on the recommendations of the reviewers and with a final decision made by the Symposium Co-chairs. Authors of selected papers will be asked, if interested, to extend their paper before submission for a *special issue in Fire Safety Journal*.

Registration fees

Fees will include: the conference registration, the proceedings, the publication costs in the open journal JPCS, the lunches, a welcome reception on Wednesday evening and the symposium banquet on Thursday evening.

Location

The conference will be located at the INIST center in Nancy, a conference center affiliated to the CNRS (French research national council), with conferences, poster sessions and restaurant for the lunches at the same place.





Nancy is the historical capital of Lorraine, in north east of France, and is located 300 km east from Paris. A major university town in France, with 47,000 students, one student per six inhabitants, Nancy is a dynamic city renowned for its extraordinary cultural and artistic heritage. Its famous Place Stanislas is regarded as one of the most beautiful royal square in Europe and its old town is a direct legacy of the Dukes of Lorraine.



Nancy is easy to reach, connected to Paris by the TGV train (1h30 from Paris and the Paris Charles de Gaulle airport TGV train station), also close to Luxemburg airport (1h30).

Numerous hotels can be booked in the direct neighborhood of the conference center, or downtown (reached in 20 minutes by the city network).
